Dear residents,

As many of you reading this may know, I came to the UK from India as a young boy, aged 7, and settled in Ilford with my family. Since then, I've lived around the Seven Kings area for over 50 years and all of the key milestones in my life, both personal and professional, have happened in this borough. From attending Mayfield School, to the birth of my children at King George's Hospital, I am proud to call Redbridge my home.

I know that I am not alone in my experience of building a life in our borough, nor is the Sikh community the only one to have made a home in Redbridge. With Black History month fast approaching, it is a timely reminder that cohesive communities are built on interaction between different groups, and crucially, support. When we join any new community, a warm welcome is what drives us to forge positive links and relationships, and feeds a determination to make a difference in our new community. Please see page 4 for Black History Month events and activities. Redbridge has a long and established history of welcoming people from across the world and helping them to build a good life here. I know that many local people from across the borough have been heartbroken by the news and scenes coming from Afghanistan over the past few months, and I have very much shared this pain. Those that are being resettled in the UK need our help and now it is time for us to step forward and be compassionate neighbours.

Earlier this month I had the privilege to announce the opening of our donation drop-off centre at Redbridge Town Hall, supporting refugees. I am incredibly grateful to our partners in the voluntary sector, including the Salvation Army, who are helping to make this happen. Donations will support refugees in need arriving from all over the world, including those from Afghanistan, and our drop-off centre will be open on Mondays and Thursdays from 10am to 4pm until further notice. I hope that you will join me in celebrating our borough's diversity, and in welcoming those seeking a new community in our borough.

In Redbridge our community spirit is our greatest strength.

The overall skeleton of the MM Ilford site is now complete, with only the fit-out and interior design left to finish over the coming weeks.

Some fantastic eateries have already been confirmed. They include Badiani, the best place in London for the iconic Italian Gelato and Fresco, the Neopoliton pizzeria who will be serving up their famously delicious pizzas.

Badiani is looking forward to launching in llford:

Applications from businesses to make Mercato their new home are still being received, and are being reviewed by the Mercato team, to ensure all trading partners meet the values of their sustainable and inclusive community food market. MM Ilford is a collaboration between Mercato, Redbridge Council and the Mayor of London, with an important part of the partnership being to bring job opportunities to our communities. During July and August almost 50 residents signed up for the virtual recruitment fair, and the Mercato's HR team is hosting open days, training sessions and interviews with Mercato's Head of People.

The Mercato urban garden project will also see successful applicants help to develop a fully functional rooftop farm on top of the building. There has been an amazing response from interested community groups and gardeners, with successful applicants due to be announced soon.

Any applications not successful for the Mercato rooftop garden will be offered the opportunity to get involved in a new upcoming exhibition at the SPACE Studios focused on green growth.

Stay Safe, Stay Kind: Prevent the spread of COVID-19 in Redbridge

It's been an incredibly challenging 18 months for our NHS. We want to celebrate the role of thousands of health workers and volunteers across the borough who have supported the COVID-19 vaccination rollout.

Since late 2020 Redbridge Council has been working in partnership with the NHS, Redbridge Clinical Commissioning Group and Healthbridge Direct, a group of GP practices in Redbridge, to make it as quick and easy as possible for everyone in the borough to get vaccinated.

This spring the partnership launched the Redbridge Vaccination Bus, a mobile vaccination unit which has visited different areas in the borough to deliver COVID-19 vaccines in our communities.

The double-decker bus, with clinicians and volunteers on site at every location, was first launched outside Balfour Road Mosque in Ilford to help those practicing Ramadan get vaccinated.

And since then the bus has toured across the borough helping residents to get their potentially life saving first and second jabs.

Dr Najib Seedat, GP at the Ilford Medical Centre:

"The vaccination bus was a great idea as it helps GPs like me get to our patients to help them get vaccinated. If you haven't yet had your first or second COVID-19 vaccination, I encourage you to book yours today. You can even book the vaccination bus for a community group, which will allow us to vaccinate more people at once in a location that works best for them."

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) has advised that young people aged 12-15, who have an underlying health condition, or who live with adults or children who have a reduced ability to fight infections and other diseases, should be vaccinated now.


If you are 16 or older, get vaccinated today.

Don't forget to also test regularly and wear masks in crowded places, especially on public transport. This will help us all reduce the risk of spreading coronavirus.





Back to school or starting school

If your child is starting school for the first time in September 2022, transferring from infant to junior school in 2022, or transferring from primary to secondary school in September 2022, you must apply online at **www.redbridge.gov.uk/ eadmissions** from 1 September 2021.

It is important that you let us know your six preferred schools **before the deadline** or you are unlikely to get a place at a school you chose.

If you do not have access to the internet you can book an appointment at Redbridge Central Library on **020 8708 2414** for help with your application.

Important information about Year 7 places at Seven Kings High School

Seven Kings School will be an 'all-through' school from September 2022. This means that the current Year 6 pupils in the primary phase will automatically be given a Year 7 place in the secondary phase in September 2022.

There will be 60 places available for those not in the primary phase of the school. Priority will go to catchment siblings.

Parents of current Year 6 children in Seven Kings School **do not need to apply for a place** if they want their child to automatically transfer in 2022.

Please be aware of this when you make your application from 1 September 2021 and ensure that you read the Admission Arrangements 2022-2023 on the Redbridge website to understand the oversubscription criteria for the school.

The Walkie Talkie group, started by Sharon Goldstone from Hainault now has almost 100 active members.

The group initially offered likeminded residents the chance to meet for a socially distanced walk, explore their local area and keep fit while meeting others.

Sharon, an education wellbeing practitioner, started the group after tragically losing a close relative to COVID-19.

She initially put out a post on the community app Nextdoor with the objective of finding similarly minded people.

As lockdown restrictions relaxed, more and more people joined the group as it progressed from walkers to an all-round social community. **Sharon said:** "Setting up this community group has been a hugely rewarding experience. Creating a group where local people come together to do something productive and help each other which is all part of community life.

"I don't do it all on my own and am particularly grateful to Paul Simons, and our team of administrators: Alan Berlyn, Dirk Andrew, Lisa Batashvili and Bettina Benjamin."

As well as walks, other activities include sports events, meals out, mindfulness, coach trips, jazz, canal trips and picnics.

More children benefitting from healthier and safer school journeys



Nearly 4,000 children across the borough are now benefitting from healthier and safer school journeys after Redbridge's successful School Streets Programme was rolled out at a further four schools at the start of September.





Avanti Court Primary School, Wanstead Church School, Aldersbrook Primary School and Fullwood Primary School are the newest additions to the programme, with Oakdale Infant and Junior Schools also set to roll-out the scheme from Monday 1 November 2021.

The initiative sees streets surrounding schools close for around one hour to motor vehicles at the start and end of school days during term-times. The closures, which are backed by headteachers and parents, help to eliminate dangerous traffic hot-spots near schools, making journeys to and from school safer.

The street entry restrictions also reduce pupils' exposure to harmful air pollution from vehicle emissions, and it also aims to encourage more walking, scooting and cycling to school.



Maria Joseph, from Poplar Way in Barkingside, has two sons attending Fullwood Primary School. She said:

"As a family we are quite mindful of the impact cars have on the environment, so we really welcome this initiative. It's great to see more children making use of scooters and cycles. There were far too many cars around the school entrance at drop-off and pick-up times previously, but now it's complete calm. We're really enjoying bringing the kids into school without having to worry about them scooting by next to cars."

Leonel Joseph, aged 7 from Fullwood Primary School, said:

"I feel really happy. I haven't been able to scoot to school for a while, and now I get to with my baby brother and that's the best. It's a really good idea to stop the cars coming near the school because it makes me feel safe on my scooter."



Executive Headteacher of Fullwood Primary School, Danvir Visvanathan, said: "Children have a right to travel to school safely and be protected from the harmful effects of air pollution, and the School Streets Programme is enabling this to happen.

"The traffic congestion previously experienced at drop-off and pick-up times was of immense concern, but the restrictions in place now significantly reduce the risks to children walking, cycling and scooting to school.

"We have already seen a big difference in the way in which our pupils arrive confidently at school on their scooters and bicycles. It is also very good for their physical well-being."

The Redbridge School Streets Programme is just one of the ways we are working towards becoming a Child Friendly Redbridge and delivering on the priorities of our children and young people.

As part of UNICEF's Child Friendly Cities and Communities programme, children from across Redbridge have told us about the importance of clean air, tackling climate change and improving road safety.

School Streets is an example of children shaping our decision making processes and shaping our policies, embodying the key principles of the Child Friendly Redbridge programme.

Our Climate Action Plan can play a key part in ensuring Redbridge residents and businesses are protected from the impact of future flash floods in the borough.



Flash flooding of the type seen in Redbridge and across East London in July had a devastating impact, as a month's worth of rain fell in just three hours. A report to full council earlier this month set out several recommendations as part of an ongoing investigation.

The report praises the resilience of residents and the response of council officers, community leaders and the emergency services in responding rapidly to the floods.

Due to climate change, there is a strong likelihood that there will be future flooding in London, and in Redbridge, which is why our council is continuing to investigate mitigation measures and demand action from the government, Thames Water, and the Environment Agency, to protect residents. We are also engaging with the insurance industry to properly support policy holders with their claims.

Meet your community crime commissioners

A ground-breaking approach to tackling crime in Redbridge is already seeing results.

The Community Crime Commission (CCC), an independent panel of 16 commissioners, launched this summer to tackle crime and the fear of crime throughout the borough.

Chaired by Dr Javed Khan OBE, the CCC focuses on key local crime concerns including anti-social behaviour, violent street crime and domestic abuse.

Here we introduce five members of the panel who explain their personal motivations for joining the CCC:



Taiwo Ademola

Taiwo works for an international non-governmental organisation and is Chief of Staff at Youth Vote UK. Taiwo



joined the crime commission to make a difference to his local community and to advocate for the rights of minority groups on local and national issues.



Joanne Hamill Joanne is the Headteacher of Oaks Park High School in Newbury Park and a member of the alongside the police, NHS

wants to help address rising concerns in local crime and advocates that education plays a vital role in tackling the root causes of crime.

Mark Glazer

After retiring as an international tax specialist, Mark dedicated his time to helping reduce crime in the local area. He became the chair

of Redbridge Neighbourhood Watch 25 years ago and since then has become the chair of the London Community Watch; working with residents in London to report crime to the police and local councils.



This summer's Redbridge Action Week saw the Council partner with the Metropolitan Police and British Transport Police to disrupt criminal activity across the borough.

A range of enforcement and intelligence-led activity resulted in 31 arrests, 162 fines and many more warning notices served to both businesses and individuals.

Weapons and firearms were taken off the streets, more than 10,000 illegal cigarettes were seized and millions of pounds worth of high end stolen vehicles were recovered.

There was also an increase in anti-social behaviour patrols, and drug dealers apprehended through the use of 24 hour CCTV.

Women and girls safety survey results revealed

This summer women and girls in Redbridge have been sharing their thoughts on what they want and need to feel safe at home, on our streets and online.

Local women and girls have shared their views through online surveys, a series of 11 virtual listening exercises and safety audit walks across the borough.

Safety Walk highlights areas where women and girls feel unsafe

The first women's safety audit walk was held on Monday 26 July.

The walk saw around 50 female residents join Redbridge Council Chief Executive Lesley Seary, Women's Safety Champion Cllr Saima Ahmed and the Leader of Redbridge Council, Cllr Jas Athwal to highlight which areas of the borough made them feel unsafe, and share their suggestions for what could be improved to make them feel safer.

Immediately following the walk, overgrown shrubbery in Valentine's Park, which was identified as making some women and girls feel unsafe, was cut back and will be continued to be monitored into the future.

Redbridge enforcement officers have also added new areas to their regular patrol routes, which were identified as hotspots for anti social behaviour.

All of the feedback received from the walk is now being considered as part of Redbridge's future enforcement strategy.

Amy Tully, a commissioner on the Redbridge Community Crime Commission, attended the

walk. She said: "It's important to understand where in Redbridge women and girls feel unsafe, and which areas require the most attention to be more accessible to women."



Almost 500 women in Redbridge have now shared their experiences and thoughts on safety in Redbridge.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the survey and share your views.

Have you experienced psychological, physical, sexual, financial, verbal or emotional abuse or harassment?



We asked what will make women and girls feel safer and the most common responses were:

- more police patrols
- more CCTV
- more/better street lighting.

We are already taking action on the outcomes of the survey, including:

- investing in more lights and CCTV across Redbridge
- using the experiences shared on safety walks to ensure they are installed in the most effective locations
- working in partnership with Metropolitan Police to direct enforcement patrols to areas where women and girls feel they are not currently visible enough.



The results of the survey revealed that a high proportion of women and girls in Redbridge have experienced harassment or abuse. Much of this has taken place on our streets.

A world of new adventures awaits at Fairlop Waters

There is a range of water sports to try all year round at Fairlop Waters, including paddle sports, sailing and rowing. Fairlop Outdoor Activity Centre offers group instructor led coaching, sailing and paddle sport courses, race sessions and equipment hire.

Session times vary throughout the season and include after-school and weekend clubs, and evening racing.

From October 2021 the QGC will aim to create a green legacy with every tree planted bringing benefits for people, wildlife, and climate, now and for the future.



Help us crack down on grime crime offenders



Fly-tipping damages our local communities, creates eyesores and can pose a danger to residents.

That's why Redbridge Council is cracking down harder than ever before on the illegal dumping in the borough.

To raise awareness of the damage caused to communities every time someone illegally dumps their rubbish on the borough's streets, this summer we launched an educational campaign about the consequences.

Our community engagement and enforcement work around fly-tipping is ongoing. Joint patrols between the council's Street Cleansing Team and Enforcement Officers take place every weekend to tackle fly-tip hot spots around the borough.

We record and investigate every report made to us, and take enforcement action if evidence is found. We aim to clear all recorded fly-tips within 24 hours of it being reported.

Every person in Britain uses roughly 10 batteries a year.

When used up, most batteries are put into rubbish bins and taken to disposal facilities where they can easily be crushed or punctured and cause fires. This can damage facilities, disrupt council services and even endanger lives.

Waste facilities serving the London Boroughs of Barking & Dagenham, Havering, Newham and Redbridge are currently undergoing major improvements to fire safety equipment. This will help ensure that fires are detected more quickly and can be put out before they spread.

However, fires can easily be avoided by disposing of batteries responsibly, so residents are encouraged to use widely available local battery recycling services which is a great way to help protect the environment.

And we've also installed street art and new lighting as we work to support the borough's recovery from the pandemic. In Ilford Lane, two new digital screens will be installed to showcase the borough.



I became a volunteer at Wanstead library as I had great memories from taking part in the reading challenge as a child, and I wanted to be involved again, but as a volunteer.

At the start of each summer, volunteers sign up for a maximum of 24 hours a week to help thousands of young children in their local community develop reading skills through the summer reading challenge. I have been lucky enough to support at least 40 children this year.
