Dear neighbours,

Part of my role as Leader of the Council is to champion the case for Redbridge and ensure that we get fair funding for our borough from the government.

We want local children and young people to have the best start life by having access to excellent education and outstanding parks and leisure facilities. And local people feel safe, which is why I've campaigned tirelessly and successfully to bring 25 additional police officers to Ilford Town (who started earlier this year), freeing up existing police officers to focus on any issues that arise across the rest of the borough.

It is also my role as Leader to make sure that any money the Council spends goes towards delivering on the priorities that matter to local people. That can mean some tough choices about how our borough's money is spent. Redbridge receives an average of £128 less in government funding per resident

LEADER'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the Spring edition of Redbridge Life

than the London average, and continues to be one of the lowest funded local authorities in the country and, yet Redbridge doesn't stand to receive a penny from the government's levelling-up fund.

Despite this, not only have we kept the services that matter to local people going throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, but we continue to invest in our borough's future. Over the past few months, we've engaged with more than 560 residents and business owners, both face to face and through our residents' survey and online forums to hear from you about the issues and services that matter most to local people. Through speaking to and meeting with our neighbours, we've been able to deliver our No-Cuts Budget for 2022/23 which keeps bread-and-butter services such as bin collections going whilst also investing in local areas. We've delivered for every corner of our borough, and we have so much more that we're ambitious and ready to deliver.

We continue to invest in the future of our borough by:

- investing in local leisure facilities, with recent upgrades completed at Woodford Green and South Woodford, construction works for Wanstead pool are underway, and a brand-new lido recently announced for Valentines Park
- investing in community safety, with an additional £1m for safety measures including more CCTV, which is monitored 24/7 and the expansion of our Enforcement Hubs programme
- investing in our award-winning parks and green spaces, with the renovation of the barns at Hainault Forest Country Park underway, to create a new community space, and plans in progress to expand Fairlop Waters.

This year's Council budget is a budget developed by local people for local people, a budget that delivers for Redbridge.

Lastly, and on a very different note, I would like to take a moment to thank my neighbours for their compassion as we have borne witness to the unfolding conflict in Ukraine. At a time of fear and uncertainty, local people here in Redbridge have stood with the people of Ukraine with incredible displays of support and generosity. Earlier this month I visited Woodford Baptist Church where the Council coordinated donations for people still in Ukraine and those having to leave their homes. Just one hour after opening we met our 48-hour donation target and we had to mobilise additional transport to take the donated items to Ukraine.

The generosity of local people reminded me of the compassion and the shared values that make Redbridge the incredible place that it is. At a time of pain for so many, the actions of neighbours from across our borough have provided a sense of hope and friendship which shines bright.

Cultural regeneration Sparks new enterprise in Ilford

Spark Lab is launching in Ilford Town Centre this spring, providing a shopfront, workshops, and creative space for local entrepreneurs looking to begin their businesses in the heart of Ilford. Redbridge Council offered the space, plus a bursary of £7,000 to budding entrepreneurs from across the borough to help kickstart their businesses.

Spark Lab launches in collaboration with cultural agency Things Made Public CIC and forms part of the Ilford Cultural Quarter. Bringing arts, creative activities and new exciting business and culture opportunities to Ilford Town Centre. Spark Lab follows council investment in arts and culture in the Town Centre, including the launch of Space art gallery which opened in Ilford in 2019, the renovation of the Kenneth More Theatre and plans to bring Mercato Metropolitano, a covered international food and drinks market to Ilford.



Cycle lanes and road safety improvement works

Work is underway to improve and expand the borough's cycle lane network to help local people travel safely, keep fit and reduce their carbon footprint.

Over the coming months we will be creating new cycle lanes, enhancing the existing cycle network, and improving road safety across the borough to help make journeys in Redbridge safer for everyone. This investment in improvement to local roads will also help to tackle congestion and pollution, and make it easier for local people to travel around by bike.

Creating a Wilderness Street in the heart of Ilford

Wilderness Street is starting to take shape in Ilford – with interactive games for local children, new planting and space for events along Oakfield Road.

Redbridge Council is working with Jan Kattein Architects and Things Made Public to create a new public square for family-friendly activities, green workshops, community planting, supper clubs, pop up exhibitions and even a food festival, part funded by the Mayor of London's Good Growth Fund.

Wilderness Street will transform an ordinary road in Ilford into a community space where local artists can showcase their work, children can play and local people can watch live music and dance performances. This exciting project aims to come to life this spring and will run until the end of summer.





For more information visit visionrcl.org.uk/groupexercise In 2021, more than 3,500 people shared their views in Redbridge's largest ever consultation on crime, highlighting five primary concerns: safety for women and girls; domestic abuse; drug-related crime and street violence; anti-social behaviour; burglary and public confidence.

In response, Leader of the Council, Cllr Jas Athwal knew he had to develop a unique initiative that could understand the root causes of crime, so he commissioned the Redbridge Community Crime Commission, ensuring that lived experiences of local people can shape council – and partner – practice.

Over six months, 16 volunteers, all passionate to create change, were supported by a community voice panel of more than 60 local people. They sifted through the evidence of expert witnesses who spoke candidly about their ambition to crack down on crime by removing barriers.

The commission found several factors that can help untangle the most pressing problems. These include improving communication between agencies and residents; the need to join-up services, and making sure that the insight of local people can truly inform how services are developed and delivered. It also reinforced the need to get help to young people early enough - to ensure they can have hope for the future.



We listened to your feedback from the survey and have already actioned:

- increased resources for ANPR Cameras and 24/7 CCTV
- womens safety walks across the borough
- pilot projects in schools to safeguard young people from gangs
- launched Enforcement Hubs and a new CCTV enforcer truck.

We look to roll out further improvements as the CCC submitted a report to our Cabinet members listing their findings and recommendations.

Enforcement Hubs

We have already delivered two Enforcement Hubs, with a third on the way, bringing police and Council Enforcement Officers into the heart of our neighbourhoods to crack down on crime, deter criminals and empower local people.

Enforcement Hubs are staffed by Police and Council Enforcement Officers so residents can pop in and raise concerns with confidence.

As well as the York Road and Hainault Enforcement Hubs, we also launched a Mobile Enforcement Hub, bringing police to every doorstep in the borough.

Keeping Redbridge Safe



Following a campaign led by Redbridge Council, local policing received a boost in February with the deployment of a new inspector, two sergeants and 21 constables to serve Ilford Town Centre.

The 25 additional police officers which joined the Ilford Town Centre team earlier this year have bolstered Redbridge's existing police force, giving the borough as a whole greater policing capacity to respond to issues across Redbridge.

The Leader of Redbridge Council, Cllr Jas Athwal, greeted the new officers on their first shift. Speaking of the new arrivals, he said:

Redbridge. Everyone deserves to feel safe on our streets and as a council we are committed to working with our partners in the police to crack down on crime and make our borough safer for local families. The extra police officers patrolling our town centre will prevent crime and send a strong message to criminals that they are not welcome in Redbridge."

The resident-led Community Crime Commission considered policing as part of its recommendations for keeping the borough safe. The new police team will work closely with existing officers and Redbridge Council Enforcement Officers as part of a strategic plan to target criminals and improve confidence amongst the community.

The council crime reduction strategy has already brought additional Enforcement Hubs in key locations across the borough and a Mobile Enforcement Hub that directs specialist resources to where they are needed.

Wherever you live in Redbridge you can rest safe in the knowledge that a team of trained officers are monitoring live CCTV footage 24 hours a day. We joined the Redbridge CCTV Team to get a behind the scenes peek at what goes on in Redbridge.

41 ANPR cameras monitored by the police form a 'ring of steel' around the borough, automatically checking for suspicious vehicles.

"Continued investment in CCTV has enabled us to upgrade the network, meaning **better quality image capture across hot-spots in the borough.**"

"We also look out for vulnerable people and keep an eye on them... if there is a rough sleeper, or if we are worried about a young person who might be at risk of exploitation, for example, we could deploy youth outreach teams to go and see them." Hayley Roberts

"Our CCTV network relies on intelligence gathered from you as residents reporting incidents they see. This helps us **allocate resources and keep CCTV operators informed**. To report any anti-social behaviour to us, visit our website at: www.redbridge.gov.uk and search 'report it'." Hayley Roberts has managed CCTV operations in Redbridge since 2016.

"A lot of people will understand our role in collecting evidence about crimes and tracking incidents as they happen. But they might not appreciate that our birds-eye view and intelligence sharing with police means that we can spot the trends in crime and anti-social behaviour. This means that we can deploy resources more efficiently, disrupting criminals and protecting our residents."

In the last three years, Redbridge CCTV has assisted in **OVER 3,200 arrests**

Keeping a watchful eye 24 hours a day





At 7pm, the overnight team is briefed on the day. The cameras are quiet and the team is reviewing footage of fly-tipping. The picture clarity means enforcement teams can issue £400 fines for a series of offences.

The evening is played out on screens, as commuters and shoppers dwindle and streets empty. Operators look out for suspicious behaviour, or the presence of known offenders.



7am

7am and the day-shift arrive, catching up on events overnight. For Hayley, the day brings one of her regular 'tasking' meetings with local police and agencies. On the agenda: plans to disrupt drug dealing activities and the deployment of new mobile cameras.

lam

The police radio for assistance locating a suspect. Altering the camera angles and zooming in, the team swiftly identify the man, tracking him across a series of cameras whilst directing the police to where he is hiding.

Calls continue through the night, with enforcement teams and police sharing insights as they patrol the borough's hotspots.

We recently agreed a series of council investments to help make our borough a better place for local people.

We continue to be short changed by government funding compared to other boroughs. The stark reality is that the average government funding per head in Redbridge is £751 compared to the London average of £879. If we received fair funding, we could provide an extra £39m worth of council services.



Work is underway to design the Lido to complement the existing landscaping in the park and further details will be revealed over the coming months.

Drawing inspiration from Rockworks Climbing Walls in Basildon Sporting Village, the centre will boast a multi-faceted climbing wall design, including a climbing wall, roped climbing lines and a small bouldering area.

One of our most exciting developments is the significant expansion of Wanstead Leisure Centre.

Cllr Jas Athwal, Leader of Redbridge Council,

said: "I am delighted to announce that we now have a new schedule in place to deliver the new Leisure Centre in Wanstead. Works are already underway on-site and will be completed at the end of 2023.

"The works we're carrying out in Wanstead will give local people access to a brand new 25m swimming pool and a new dance studio to complement the existing gym, badminton and squash courts."





Hainault Forest Country Park A hidden gem in the suburbs of London



In 2019, we successfully secured over $\pounds7$ million of funding to restore and enhance Hainault Forest.

£1.25M of Redbridge Council funding combined with additional funding from the National Lottery Heritage Fund, the Mayor's Fund at the Greater London Authority, and Redbridge Council.

The renovation will deliver:

• a new visitor hub with event space, cafe and information centre

an updated and improved animal farm

• a programme of activities including training, volunteering, work experience and learning opportunities

• the complete restoration of the original Victorian barn and foxburrows barns which will offer craft workshops and opportunities for local

• new landscaping to help with biodiversity and protect animal habitats.

In summer 2021, we committed to doubling the size of Fairlop Waters Country Park over the coming years.

- a revitalised Fairlop Outdoor Activity Centre (FOAC) will offer opportunities for more residents to benefit from the wide range of water and outdoor activities
- a new adventure trail that will create a circuit of the park



consulted during the summer of 2022, with the final plan due back to Cabinet in October 2022.

The site will also benefit from:

- new accessible benches and tables that are being installed during March
- a summer programme to include pop-up open-air entertainment and performances
- new improved signage to promote the new boating offer.

Don't let a fear of needles stop you from being vaccinated. Just tell the vaccination team and they will take great care of you and help you have the best experience.

Vaccines save lives, and being vaccinated could save your life.



On Thursday 5 May you can have your say over what happens in our borough by taking part in the local elections. All London borough councils and local authorities in Wales and Scotland are taking part in these elections.

Who are the candidates?

The nominations period will end on 5 April. On 6 April, we will publish the final list of candidates for the local elections on our website.

Who is eligible to vote in these elections?

All residents on the electoral register are eligible to vote in these elections, except for British citizens living overseas. But you must make sure you register to vote.

The five new purpose-built Community Hubs will be in Seven Kings, Gants Hill, Hainault, Woodford and Wanstead, and there will be a central Civic Hub in Ilford.

Community Hubs update

Community Hubs bring key services like Libraries, GP surgeries, Gyms and Children's Centres all under one roof. We're planning to build five Community Hubs in Redbridge so everyone in the borough will live less than 20 minutes walk from their local Hub.

Each Hub is being co-designed with residents to meet the needs of local areas, giving residents the power to shape, design, deliver and run the hubs in partnership with Redbridge Council.

The resident co-design of the Seven Kings hub so far has planned for a state-of-the-art library, café and GP surgery, with the proposal it is run through a pioneering, community-led model, supported by the Council and a range of local partners.

More than 1,000 people have been engaged in the programme so far, and this is increasing daily. Residents are feeding in their views on what they and their neighbours need to create and maintain thriving, inspiring communities in which they can take pride in.

Almost two million pounds distributed to residents this winter

Last year The Government provided the council with £1.97m from the Household Support Fund. We then distributed this to local residents most in need of help this winter.

By the 31 March we will have made over 25,000 awards of support to local households, helping people with food, energy bill, water and council tax bills plus housing necessities and wider living costs.



Thousands of children who were eligible for free school meals were also supported throughout the school nolidays to ensure they could enjoy a substantial lunch time meal.

The Council also injected £200,000 of the funding into local food banks pefore Christmas to bolster their capacity to help local residents. It is estimated that this funding will support up to 80,000 offers of food nelp to local residents in need.

Redbridge calls on the Government to 'end rough sleeping for good'

We have called on the Government to 'end rough sleeping for good' and to scrap immigration rules that make rough sleeping grounds for refusing or cancelling a person's leave to remain in the UK.

Leader of Redbridge Council, Cllr Jas Athwal said:

"Rough sleepers already face unimaginable obstacles, and these hardships are magnified for those who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF) under the government's immigration rules. As a local authority, our hands are tied when it comes to helping those individuals who find themselves sleeping rough if their immigration status is unclear, or if they no longer have a visa to stay in the UK."



The council are offering **Go Green Grants** to help homeowners and landlords improve the energy efficiency of their properties through the installation of low-carbon heating improvements. This could help keep homes warmer and save money on energy bills.

Eligibility

Homeowners and landlords are eligible to apply for the scheme. In the case of a rented property, the household income criteria is related to the income of the tenants living in the property, and not the landlord's income.

To be eligible, households must:

- Have a household income of £30,000 or less
- Live in a property with an EPC rating of D, E, F, or G

Types of work that can be carried out

As part of the application process, your property will undergo an assessment that will recommend the appropriate measures. This could include, for example,

- Cavity Wall Insulation
- External Wall Insulation
- Solid Wall, loft and floor insulation

and more

Cost

If you are an owner occupier the works to your property will be fully funded by the grant up to a maximum of £10,000.

Where a property is rented, the maximum grant funding available is **£5,000** per household. In all cases the landlord will need to contribute one third or more if the works are above **£5,000**.
